**Case 1**                      Dr Adrian Bateman

Whipple's procedure performed on a 30 year old man for recurrent pancreatitis. Macroscopic examination of the excision specimen revealed a firm pancreas in which the local anatomy was difficult to identify. No masses were present within the pancreas. A pale nodule was present within the duodenal wall and a second nodule was present within the pre-pylori region.

**Case 2**                      Dr Fiona Campbell

67 year old male. Cystic lesion in tail of pancreas.

**Case 3**                      Dr Beate Haugk

19 year old female with cystic mass in head of pancreas. FNA suggests neoplasm.

**Case 4**                      Dr Sue Davies

Incidental nodule noted below the capsule at liver resection for a benign inflammatory stricture in a 51 year old female.

**Case 5**                      Dr Judy Wyatt

Previous history - liver transplant in March 2007 for HCV cirrhosis with a 3.5cm HCC. Subsequently developed liver nodule, 1cm diameter, in left lobe of graft, first detected at 8 months post transplant. This enlarged and developed imaging features of HCC, resected July 2008.

**Case 6**                      Professor Sebastian Lucas

Turkish male age 24 years. At a UK airport, involved in a fracas and received trauma to the abdomen. Collapsed and taken to hospital. Impression of bleeding into the liver. Angiographic control attempted and failed. At laparotomy, massively enlarged liver ??sarcoma. Biopsies taken from left and right lobes.

**Case 7**

Professor Bernard Portmann

A 23 year old Chinese woman from Hong Kong, in this country for over a year. She presented with jaundice when 18-20 weeks pregnant. A clinical diagnosis of chronic active hepatitis was reached and the patient was started on steroids prior to liver biopsy followed by spontaneous miscarriage 24 hours later. She received a liver transplant for decompensated cirrhosis with severe cholestasis 5 years later. Brother affected by similar cholestasis with recurrent pruritis. Tissue block from her liver removed at transplantation. (*H&E and Orcein*)

**Case 8**

Professor Stefan Hübscher

A 52 year old male with recent onset jaundice and abnormal LFTs. AST793 (normal 5-43); ALP 655 (70-330); bilirubin 172 (1-22); ANA positive (1:100); SMA positive; IgG 19.5 (normal 6-16). Liver biopsy performed.
